

WALKING THROUGH NAIROBI'S HISTORY

(Part I, Southern part of CBD)

TEKWA would like to invite you for a walk through the Southern part of Nairobi, introducing you to the development as well as to important historical sites in this part of our city and making you aware that Nairobi has more to offer than traffic jams. To avoid those, the tour will be on a Sunday morning. As we end at the Stanley Hotel, there is an option to have lunch or a snack at the famous Thorne Tree restaurant.

This tour includes: visit to Kenyatta Mausoleum, Parliament Building, Sheria House, the Railway Museum, Railway Station, Memorial Park, City Hall, Law Courts, KICC (roof top), Dedan Kimathi Statue, Elite and Kimathi House, New Stanley Hotel. (With the exception of Railway Museum, Memorial Park, KICC there is no visit of the buildings possible).

This is a walking tour; comfortable shoes, a hat and some water are recommended.

Start: 09.30 am
End: about 1.30 pm at New Stanley Hotel (possibility to have a snack)
Participants: min. 4, max. 12.
Costs: KES 5000/- per person/resident status; KES 6,000/- per person non-resident status. This includes all entrance fees. Please, carry your ID or Passport for proof of resident status. (Inquire about costs for smaller groups.)
Meeting point: 09.30 am at the Railway Museum (Access by car from Mombasa Road)



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
